Kingston Arts Council and the City of Kingston announce 2017 City of Kingston Arts Fund Recipients

The Kingston Arts Council (KAC) and the City of Kingston are pleased to announce the recipients of the 2017 City of Kingston Arts Fund (CKAF). An annual fund administered by the KAC on behalf of the City, the CKAF provides grants to local arts groups, organizations, and collectives to foster creativity at all levels and enrich how Kingston residents experience and engage with the arts.

This year, the CKAF totaled \$564,000 with approximately 70 per cent going towards operating grants and 30 per cent to project grants. Applications were reviewed by a jury comprised of representatives of the arts, arts professionals, practitioners and supporters of the arts with high standing and expertise of the arts and the Kingston community.

The City of Kingston Arts Fund (CKAF) aims to nurture the capacity of the arts, artists and the arts sector in Kingston while fostering creativity, encouraging social cohesion, enhancing quality of life and stimulating economic development through direct investment.

In 2007, Kingston City Council established the City of Kingston Arts Fund. The Kingston Arts Council was contracted to administer CKAF. Each year, the KAC submits a Plan for Administration of CKAF that is approved by City Council. CKAF enables Kingston's City Council to continue to invest in and support the arts, heritage and culture in Kingston. The City of Kingston has invested over \$5.4 million in the local arts community since 2007 through this program.
