2022 City of Kingston Arts Fund Operating and Project Grant Recipients Announced

The Kingston Arts Council (KAC) is pleased to announce the recipients of the 2022 City of Kingston Arts Fund (CKAF). CKAF is an annual fund administered by the KAC on behalf of the City of Kingston and it provides Operating and Project Grants to local arts organizations, collectives, and artists to foster creativity at all levels and enrich how Kingston residents experience and engage with the arts. Operating Grants foster sustainability among leading arts organizations by providing funding for operations and programming and Project Grants fund the creation and presentation of arts projects that engage the community and professional artists. For the first time, individual professional artists were eligible to apply to CKAF Project Grants, in addition to non-profit organizations and collectives.

This year, the total CKAF amount available was \$613,503 with \$429,451 available for Operating Grants and \$184,052 available for Project Grants. Applications were reviewed by the Grants Committee jury that was comprised of artists and arts professionals with high standing and expertise of the arts and the Kingston community. Ex-officio members of the Grants Committee support the work of the jury and bring forward broad community perspectives, provide information on the City of Kingston objectives for the CKAF program, and are present to ensure transparency and fairness in the process. Adjudication meetings were hosted on 17 May (Operating Grants) and 19 May (Project Grants).

"The City of Kingston Arts Fund is essential funding, now more than ever, to support Kingston's arts and culture sector and increase quality of life for our community," says Felix Lee, Executive Director, Kingston Arts Council. "Despite the challenges of the pandemic, local artists and arts organizations have continued to do innovative work that uplifts and engages us."
