2021 City of Kingston Arts Fund Operating and Project Grant Recipients Announced

The Kingston Arts Council (KAC) is pleased to announce the recipients of the 2021 City of Kingston Arts Fund (CKAF). An annual fund administered by the KAC on behalf of the City of Kingston, CKAF provides operating and project grants to local arts organizations and collectives to foster creativity at all levels and enrich how Kingston residents experience and engage with the arts. Operating grants foster sustainability among leading arts organizations by providing funding for operations and programming and project grants fund the creation and presentation of arts projects.

This year, the total CKAF amount available was \$583,052 with \$423,718 available for Operating Grants and \$159,334 available for Project Grants. Applications were reviewed by the Grants Committee jury that was comprised of representatives of the arts including arts professionals, practitioners and supporters of the arts with high standing and expertise of the arts and the Kingston community. Ex-officio members of the Grants Committee support the work of the jury and bring forward broad community perspectives, provide information on the City of Kingston objectives for the CKAF program, and are present to ensure transparency and fairness in the process. Adjudication meetings were hosted digitally on May 25 (Operating) and May 27 (Project).
