## **The Kingston Arts Council and Community Foundation for Kingston & Area Announce Recipient of 2025 Nan Yeomans Grant for Artistic Development**

The Kingston Arts Council (KAC) and the Community Foundation for Kingston & Area (CFKA) are pleased to announce that Lee Jones is the recipient of the 2025 Nan Yeomans Grant for Artistic Development.

The Nan Yeomans Grant is valued at \$4,000 and made possible through an endowment fund held by the CFKA. The grant assists promising young artists and artisans in furthering their education and professional artistic growth. Nan Yeomans (1923-2004) was a prominent Kingston artist dedicated to supporting local and emerging artists in the visual arts. The KAC administers the grant and the recipient is selected by a peer jury of artists and arts professionals. The 2025 jury included previous year's recipient, Alanna Hakim, and local artists Michelle Reid and Harvey Doniego.



### **About Lee Jones**

Lee Jones is a digital media and fibre artist who creates interactive textiles. E-textiles (or electronic textiles) might sound like science-fiction, but are actually a fun and easy way to learn all about electricity and physical computing. In her practice she works with craft communities and develops DIY toolkits so individuals can design and create interactive soft technologies to suit their own needs. She also loves running community e-textile workshops at art galleries and makerspaces, and creating interactive participatory artworks.

## **About the Nan Yeomans Grant for Artistic Development**

Nan Yeomans was a prominent Kingston artist who was dedicated to supporting local and emerging visual artists. In her late twenties, she enjoyed three summers at Queen's University Summer School of Fine Arts, and subsequently lived most of her adult life in Kingston. Throughout her 82 years, in addition to staying busy with her art and other responsibilities, Yeomans always found time to contribute to the community. She passed away in 2004, leaving all of her art and almost all of her estate to the Community Foundation for Kingston & Area.

It was Nan's wish to fund a grant for promising young artists and artisans developing their visual art talents in the greater Kingston area. The Nan Yeomans Fund, established through the Community Foundation for Kingston & Area with her bequest, now provides an annual award in her name, administered by the Kingston Arts Council.
